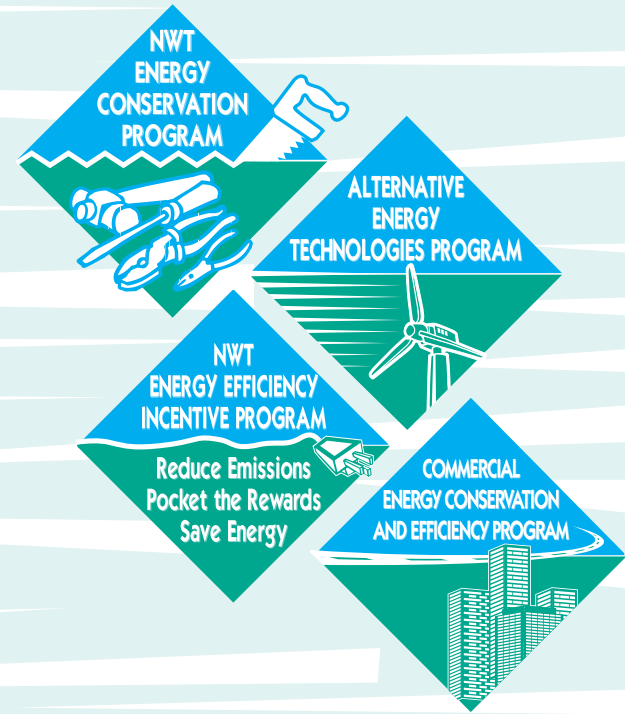

The Government of the Northwest Territories is committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and assisting residents with the high cost of energy. Four programs, developed under the NWT Greenhouse Gas Strategy and the NWT Energy Plan, are helping Northwest Territories (NWT) residents, businesses and communities save energy, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and other air pollutants, and save money.



## Energy Conservation Program

For communities, Aboriginal governments and non-profit organizations

The Energy Conservation Program (ECP) is designed to help community-funded departments, boards and agencies, Aboriginal governments and non-profit organizations use the water and energy resources of the NWT more efficiently.

Your community organization can access funding from ECP to:

- install or upgrade energy efficient heating or lighting equipment;
- install low flow toilets and other water saving devices;
- retrofit a building to become more energy efficient; or
- be creative. If you have an idea that you think will save your community energy or water dollars call Environment and Natural Resources.

Funding of up to \$50,000 is available for eligible projects.



## Alternative Energy Technologies Program

Alternative energies, such as solar and wind, provide energy using no fossil fuels. The Alternative Energy Technologies Program (AETP) has three categories designed to meet the needs of communities, businesses and residents.

### Community Renewable Energy Fund

This fund promotes support to communities, Aboriginal governments, non-profits and GNWT departments for projects that advance the knowledge and effectiveness of new clean energy technologies in the NWT.

Matching grants of up to \$50,000 per year are available to generate energy using no fossil fuels.

**New – Wood pellet boilers and furnaces are now eligible.**

### Medium Renewable Energy Fund

Funding is available for commercial businesses, including off-grid lodges and camps, to reduce their fossil fuel use in remote locations where added transportation cost to ship the fuel increases its price.

Grants of up to one-third of eligible costs, to a maximum of \$15,000 per year, are available.

### Small Renewable Energy Fund

Funding is available to assist NWT residents to integrate commercially available, clean energy technologies on their property, building or other assets, with the intent of reducing fuel usage.

Grants of up to one-third of eligible costs, to a maximum of \$5,000 per year, are available through a simple application form.



## Energy Efficiency Incentive Program

For residents, businesses and non-profit organizations

Reduce Emissions  
Pocket the Rewards  
Save Energy

The Energy Efficiency Incentive Program (EEIP) helps homeowners, businesses and non-profit organizations purchase new, more energy efficient models of products they use every day. Rebates include: washing machines, refrigerators, low flush toilets, wood stoves and wood pellet stoves, oil and gas furnaces and boilers, hot water heaters, heat recovery ventilators, outdoor motors, windows, doors, drain water heat recovery systems, and home insulation.

For a full rebate, qualifying products must be purchased in the NWT. Qualifying products purchased outside the NWT, but within Canada, are eligible for 50% of the rebate amounts. By completing an application form and attaching a copy of the sales receipt, residents can get a rebate of up to \$1,000.



## Commercial Energy Conservation and Efficiency Program

For businesses

**NEW!**

The Commercial Energy Conservation and Efficiency Program (CECEP) provides rebates for the implementation of cost-effective energy conservation and efficiency measures in NWT businesses. The program provides funding to eligible businesses to implement projects with energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions reduction potential. Main areas of focus include: heating and heating controls, air sealing, lighting and lighting controls, ventilation and ventilation controls, hot water and low flow devices, and others.

Funding of up to \$10,000 is available for eligible projects.
