

## How the EEIP Works

1. For a full rebate, purchase an eligible product from a participating NWT dealer. Participating NWT vendors have the list of eligible products (and the application form), or check online at [www.aea.nt.ca](http://www.aea.nt.ca). Qualifying products purchased outside the NWT, within Canada, are eligible for 50% of the rebate.
2. Complete the application form and attach a copy of the sales receipt and manufacturer's documents (if possible). Make sure the sales receipt (proof of purchase) clearly indicates payment in full, the amount paid, the date of purchase, and the make and model of the product.
3. Mail, fax or deliver the application form and sales receipt to the Arctic Energy Alliance.
  - The rebate application and sales receipt for updated rebate categories must be dated September 1, 2009, or later.
  - Please allow six weeks for delivery of your rebate cheque.

## The Fine Print...

This program is available to all NWT residents, businesses and non-profit organizations. Federal and territorial government departments are not eligible.

The program is in the form of a mail-in rebate for energy efficient appliances, heating appliances and outboard motors.

Only products specified within this guideline are eligible for rebates.

To be eligible for a full rebate, products must be purchased through NWT dealers. A list of participating NWT dealers is available on the Arctic Energy Alliance web site: [www.aea.nt.ca](http://www.aea.nt.ca). Qualifying products purchased outside the NWT, but within Canada, are eligible for 50% of the rebate amounts.

EEIP also provides matching grants, which NWT residents receive through Natural Resources Canada's ecoENERGY Retrofit Program on qualifying retrofits of insulation, air sealing, doors, windows and skylights.

EEIP rebate categories have changed effective September 1, 2009. Products purchased prior to September 1, 2009, are only eligible for rebates offered in the previous year's program.

Residents can apply for more than one rebate, to a maximum of two items per category, per household, per calendar year.

Appliances purchased for installation at temporary or seasonal residences are not eligible.

Businesses and non-profit organizations are eligible for rebates (with the exception of home retrofits) to a maximum of five products per rebate category, per calendar year.

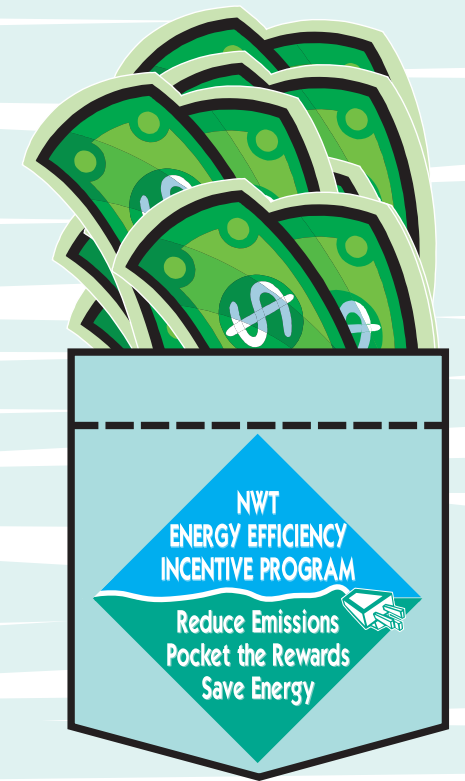
The Arctic Energy Alliance is not responsible for lost, late, incomplete or unreadable applications.

# Pocket the Rewards of Energy Efficiency!

The Energy Efficiency Incentive Program (EEIP) was designed to help homeowners and consumers purchase new, more energy efficient models of products that they use every day. Buying energy efficient products will help you to save energy costs while reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Here's what you'll get back when you purchase a qualifying model in these categories:

## Appliances

Your fridge and washing machine are two of the biggest energy users in your home. If you want to lower your electricity bill, you can get a \$400 rebate if you live in a community powered by diesel or natural gas or \$100 if you live in a community served by hydropower. All you need to do is to purchase a new ENERGY STAR® fridge or washing machine. These two items use three to four times less energy than an inefficient model.

**New!** Big savings can be made on your water bill as well. Toilets use on average of 20% of your water. Standard toilets use three times as much water as new low flush models. Replace your toilets and save big. Low flush toilets must meet the requirements of the ecoENERGY Retrofit Program.

Ask your vendor to help you choose an ENERGY STAR® appliance or low flush toilet, or visit the Arctic Energy Alliance at [www.aea.nt.ca](http://www.aea.nt.ca) to find out more.

## Heating Appliances

Efficient furnaces, boilers and hot water tanks are important to our comfort in the Northwest Territories. Is your heating source as efficient as it can be? Consider installing an emission neutral wood stove or pellet stove, or replace your furnace with a highly efficient model. Add an efficient water heater and you'll not only be cozy and warm all winter long, you'll also pocket the rebate rewards. Plus, you'll be saving energy and money for many years to come.

Wood pellet appliances	\$1,000 — pellet boiler (ULC certified) \$700 — pellet furnace (ULC certified) \$500 — pellet stove (ULC certified)
Heat recovery ventilators	\$300 — (certified by the Home Ventilating Institute, <a href="http://www.hvi.org">www.hvi.org</a> )
Oil furnaces and boilers	\$900 — oil furnace 92% AFUE* \$600 — oil boiler 85% AFUE \$500 — oil furnace 85% AFUE** \$300 — oil furnace 85% AFUE \$250 — oil furnace for mobile home 80% AFUE

## Outboard Motors

Boats are an important mode of transport in the Northwest Territories. If you are still using an older, inefficient motor, now is the time to replace it. CARB three-star certified motors are eligible for rebates. Ask your local dealer which models qualify. With the help of a rebate from the EEIP, the choice is clear!
